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

24 Eggs 1/4 Cup Mayonnaise 3 Tbs Apple Cider Vinegar 1/2 Cup Dijon Mustard <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Cup Sweet Relish Salt (to taste) Pepper (to taste) Smoked Paprika (for garnish)

Place the eggs in cold water and bring a pan to a boil. Cook for 12 minutes, keeping the water at a simmer. Drain and rinse the boiled eggs. Crack egg shells and carefully peel under cool


running water. Gently dry with towels. Slice the eggs in half lengthwise, removing yolks to a medium bowl, and placing the whites on a serving platter. Mash the yolks into a fine crumble using a fork. Add mayonnaise, vinegar, mustard,

relish, salt, pepper, and mix well. Pipe the egg yolk mixture into the egg white shells

using a piping bag and tip. Garnish with Smoked Paprika, or other garnish of

your choosing.

#### That green dress!

That's what The Greenbrier's historian, Dr. Bob Conte, remembers most about the day he first saw Betsy Powers, The Greenbrier's newest employee, on Labor Day Weekend 1988.

"Wow! Look at that one," said Dr. Conte of his first impression. "That's what I first thought. There was a green dress, and I wasn't the only one who said, 'Oh my, look at her."

Nearly 31-years later, Dr. Conte and Betsy (Powers) Conte are preparing to celebrate their 30th wedding anniversary and cherishing a love story that is almost as unlikely as it is inspiring.

How do a California boy and a Carolina girl end up building a life together in the mountains of West Virginia? The only way this couple, which isn't shy about its faith, can describe being brought together is that God had a hand in their story.

Bob, a native of San Jose, California, who studied history at Santa Clara University and obtained a Ph.D. in American Studies from Case Western Reserve University, was working in Washington, D.C., when he first saw The Greenbrier in 1976. While visiting Pipestem State Park, Bob and a friend traveled to White Sulphur Springs, because they had heard there was something famous there. After a few trips up and down Main Street, and seeing nothing famous, they turned into The Greenbrier and found the famed location for which they had been searching.

"If you come to The Greenbrier with no preconceived notions about what to expect, it's pretty amazing," said Bob. "I was blown away."

He left, though, thinking it was the last time he would see the place.

Two years later, Bob, who was 31 at the time and working on a project for the National Archives, got a call from The Greenbrier's general manager, Bill Pitt, who wanted him to go through the records stored in the attic of the historic resort and begin to archive the collection.

Bob, whose present job was about to run out of grant money, accepted, and he moved to West Virginia, settling in Monroe County, where he was impressed by the back-tothe-land movement that was occuring there. He expected to stay a few years and move onto the next adventure.

Ten years after Bob was hired at The Greenbrier, and the archives still weren't fully catalogued, Betsy, who

had developed a wardrobe consulting business in her hometown of Charlotte, N.C., after graduating from Radford College and getting a Master's from Virginia Tech, was looking for a change. She had visited The Greenbrier to present her wardrobe program on the request of Vivian Conley and Anne Walker, who worked for the resort. They had been impressed with her work, so when a position opened for a Director of Social Activities, they asked Betsy if she would be interested.

"I really felt called to The Greenbrier," said Betsy. "It was just a matter of changing course in life. It was a nice fit. It was a change.



"My mother and daddy thought I had lost my mind. They said, 'You're leaving Charlotte?' I just needed to take a little detour. I expected to come back in five years or less."

It didn't take long, though, for plans to change.

When Betsy arrived at The Greenbrier in September of 1988, she immediately made an impression on Bob. Since part of her job

description involved giving tours of the property, Bob, who by that time had transitioned into the role of historian, decided it was his duty to show the newest team member around the property and pass on his knowledge of the famed resort.

"When I approached her, I was doing my role and passing on information," said Bob with a chuckle. "I mean, what else was I supposed to do?"

The date, or the tour – even today, the couple isn't exactly sure what to call that first encounter – started right after lunch and included a walk through The Greenbrier property and a drive well beyond. Bob's tour of the grounds and the surrounding history included a stop in Sweet Springs and a visit to a cemetery.

"On our first date, we went to a cemetery, and I've never lived it down," he remembers. "But I was trying to put The

Greenbrier in context with the other resorts in the 19th century. And there was some reason this cemetery was of some significance."

Fortunately for Bob, the date got better from there.

"Bob just brought history to life," said Betsy. "We just had fun. I remember that first day, we were out for hours. We left right after lunch. It was close to 7 o'clock, and we had traced all over the property. We were down at golf and then came back into hotel and Bob said, 'I guess you're probably hungry?"

So Bob walked Betsy to one of The Greenbrier's most iconic spots, The Main Dining Room, where they were greeted by longtime captain Jack O'Donnell, who told the two he had the perfect table for them – an out of the way table for two, where they wouldn't be disturbed.

"Jack knew what he was doing," said Bob with a laugh.

"It was the perfect table for two, and it was a wonderful dinner and a wonderful evening," added Betsy. "I'm here. I'm from Charlotte. I don't know anybody, and Bob had spent his entire day with me. It was extraordinary."

After dinner, Bob took Betsy to the balcony of The Greenbrier Suite, where the two could look out over the entire immaculate property.

"It was so overwhelming to me," said Betsy. "I believe it was love at first sight. They talk about chemistry between people. The chemistry was just, 'BAM!"

Bob wanted to see more of Betsy and Betsy more of Bob after that first amazing night, but for some time the lines between work and romance were blurred. Bob did his best to help Betsy familiarize herself with every aspect of the property, but because of what he perceived as a major age gap, he wasn't



sure whether to move full speed ahead.

"I misjudged Betsy's age," he explained with a chuckle. "I thought she was considerably younger than me. One day

when we were walking across the grounds, she happened to mention her age. She was closer to my age than I thought, which meant fair game. So all of the sudden, the picture shifted.

"I had her pegged as 32, and I was 42. I thought that was too much. But we were walking along, and she happened to say she was 37. That shaved off five years."

So Bob went all in with his courtship of Betsy, a romance that took place in plain view of nearly everyone who visited The Greenbrier.

"At that time, Betsy's desk was in the middle of the lobby," Bob remembers. "There's not much privacy in the lobby of a resort. I don't think it was any secret. I would walk by her desk all the time, and there was always a reason."

Bob did everything to try to impress the redhead in the green dress. He had blown some inheritance money on a fancy new sports car, and on one of his walks around the property, he made sure to show off those wheels.

"I was walking along, and I said, 'Oh, I need to get something in my car," said Bob. "Of course, there was nothing in the car. But she reacted perfectly and said, 'Oh, that's your car?'

"When you're a historian, you have an image problem. So the snazzy car helped."

Six months after that initial tour of the property, the romance was blossoming and moving quickly. The couple points to a wine dinner in the Crystal Room at The Greenbrier in March of 1989 as a moment that it realized something out of the ordinary was happening.

"I don't know that anything particular happened there, but by that time there was a sense of comfort," said Bob, who pointed out that the couple still has the menu from that dinner hanging in their dining room. "There had been some of those one step forward and two steps back situations, but by that point, we thought we could make this happen.

"We had both been married before, and we pretty quickly figured out that this was a good deal."

On July 1, 1989, 10 months after the courtship began, the couple married in front of the iconic Springhouse on The Greenbrier property.

"It was just beautiful," said Betsy. "It was a perfect day. Someone later said that it was supposed to rain all day, but it never rained."

The reception took place at the Presidents Cottage Museum, a special place in the history of The Greenbrier, which also became a notable location to the Contes. The honeymoon was one night at The Greenbrier. They moved into Bob's home just south of Union, West Virginia, and settled into a life together.

"We went right to it," said Bob. "We had two children the first three years. We were a little more mature, and we knew what we wanted. We were committed to the idea of marriage. There was the romance end of it, but there was also the idea of making it work. We had both seen other ones not work, and we weren't going to do that again."

In a way, Bob and Betsy agree, the last 30 years have been one big honeymoon. They love to travel together and have been to New York, Florida, California, Hawaii, Italy, Ireland and many other exotic locations together. All, in Betsy's words, have been, "Just wonderful trips."

The day-to-day interaction at work has never grown stale, either.

Bob and Betsy don't subscribe to the notion of not talking about work at home. The Greenbrier is a huge part of their lives, and they talk about the grand resort on a daily basis.

"It's just part of our lives," said Betsy. "We talk about work, scheduling, kids, vacation, it's just completely meshed. We're here and we're family. Not being from this area, we were adopted by so many. It's a beautiful place to live.

"We love coming to work, and we love what we do here. We continue to focus on guests and other team members, and we really do have a good time. We've just had a blessed and great life. It has truly flown by."

As much as they enjoy their time together, Bob and Betsy also believe it's important to have their own hobbies and interests. Bob loves to golf and spends many spring and summer afternoons on the famous courses around The Greenbrier. Betsy is still into fashion. She gives seminars from time to time and sells cosmetics as a side job.

Together, Bob and Betsy have two children, Mary Cecilia and Nicholas. Mary Cecilia graduated from Wake Forest University and is currently working in the Monroe County school system. Nicholas, who also graduated from Wake Forest, is currently living in Salt Lake City and is a member of the Utah National Guard. He will soon enroll at the University of Utah to pursue a law degree.

Bob also has two boys from a previous marriage, Sam, who is a registered nurse at Union Memorial Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, and Daniel, who lives in Emmonak, Alaska, and teaches English. Sam has a 4-year-old daughter, Ramona, Bob and Betsy's only grandchild.

And it all began with The Greenbrier and a green dress.

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

#### WELCOME RECEPTION





## Automobile History at America's Resort

The Greenbrier has been a part of a number of car designs over the years, including several unique projects featuring the resort's iconic name.

- In 1952, Nash Motors released the Nash Rambler Greenbrier station wagon. The cars received upgraded trim with two-tone painted exteriors, and they were originally priced around \$2,000. The 1953 Nash Deliveryman model also included a Greenbrier trim, and 3,536 of those were sold that year. In 1959, Nash, now owned by American Motors, introduced a new Greenbrier model, the Nash Rambler Greenbrier Super Wagon.
- The Greenbrier name was also used on a pair of Chevrolet vehicles in the 1960s and early '70s. The Chevrolet Corvair Greenbrier Sportswagon was in production from 1961 through 1965. It seated up to nine people with an available third-row seat. From 1969 through 1972 the Chevrolet Chevelle Greenbrier was produced. This was a deluxe model of the company's four-door station wagon.
- The Greenbrier's famed interior decorator, Dorothy Draper, was involved in designing several car interiors, including a line for Packard and Chrysler in the 1950s.

Of course, The Greenbrier has owned plenty of automobiles of its own over the years and still has a fleet of vehicles today used for transporting guests and moving equipment. Vehicles owned by the resort in the past include Packards, Cadillacs and Mercurys, Rolls-Royces and numerous transport vans and trucks.



In 1950, the governors of all 48 U.S. states and the nation's four territories met at The Greenbrier for the 42nd annual Governors' Conference. Ford Motor Company provided 60 new 1950 automobiles for the occasion, all painted in the distinctive Greenbrier Green. Each governor had access to one of the cars with a state police chauffeur throughout the stay.

Cadillac, Buick, Chevrolet, Chrysler, Nash, Lincoln, Packard, Plymouth and Oldsmobile have all used the signature Greenbrier brand in advertising campaigns over the last century.

The connection between The Greenbrier and the automobile world is an extensive one and today those roots are not only continued, but they are celebrated with the annual Greenbrier Concours d'Elegance.

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

With A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier moving to September, golf will be available on all courses through the summer, a welcome change for members and guests.

"The heart of our season will now be available for all of our loyal patrons," said Harris. "We have some new staff members, a new host of professionals, and we're here to guarantee our guests have an amazing experience."

#### **THE COURSES**

#### The Old White TPC

The iconic centerpiece of golf at The Greenbrier is The Old White TPC Course, a 1914 CB Macdonald/Seth Raynor masterpiece that annually hosts the PGA TOUR's *A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier*. It officially opened for play on March 30 and will be open through the end of November, weather permitting.

A legend of golf history at The Greenbrier, the course was named for the Old White Hotel, which stood on the resort grounds from 1858 through 1922. Macdonald, known as the father of American golf course architecture, modeled several holes from some of the most famous

in Europe. His associate, Seth Raynor, assisted in the course construction and returned in the 1920s to oversee updates to the golf course.

Due to a catastrophic weather event in 2016, The Old White TPC was reconstructed and fully restored to its original glory by July of 2017. By fully embracing the original Macdonald/Raynor elements, the course has received tremendous reviews over the last two years and will be in peak condition throughout the summer as officials prepare for *A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier*, which will be held Sept. 9-15, 2019, on the iconic course.

"We'll be grooming the course all summer, so we really anticipate our conditions being both excellent and accessible," said Harris. "It's truly an iconic course, and we have guests come from around the world to have the experience of playing The Old White TPC."

#### The Meadows

Also redesigned in 2017, The Meadows – originally built by Alexander Findlay as a ninehole course in 1911, redesigned by Seth Raynor in 1923, expanded to an 18-hole routing by Dick Wilson in 1962 and eventually redesigned by Bob Cupp in 1999 – now includes six holes from the original Greenbrier Course layout. It also features breathtaking mountain vistas and unique stacked sod bunkers, giving the course a much different feel than the others on The Greenbrier property.

"The sentiment has been really good," said Harris. "The guests really like it. It has many beautiful holes and great shot values."

The Meadows remains open throughout the year as long as weather allows for play.

#### The Greenbrier

First opened for play in 1924 after being designed by Seth Raynor, The Greenbrier Course was redesigned in 1977 by Jack Nicklaus in preparation for the 1979 Ryder Cup, which celebrates its 40th anniversary this year. In 1994, The Greenbrier Course hosted the Solheim Cup, making it the only resort course in the world to host both prestigious events.

But that's only part of the course's rich history.

From 1985 through 1987, The Greenbrier Course was the site of The Greenbrier American Express Championship, a PGA TOUR Champions event.

Sam Snead shot a 59 in the final round of the 1959 Spring Festival on the course, making him the first known golfer to accomplish the rare feat during competition play.

Also heavily impacted by weather in 2016, The Greenbrier course opened as a 9-hole routing late last summer, and it will be a 9-hole course once again when it opens for play May 17 through October 14.

"We opened in 2018 because our guests requested it," said Harris. "The ground itself is just so spectacular. It just has an amazing feel,









and then to think of all the Major Champions who have played there, you can feel that history. So, our guests told us they wanted it.

"We listened to them and got it open, but this year we feel like it will really be in top condition, and that history will be kept alive. We're excited about having a 9-hole option for our guests."

#### The Ashford Short Course

Though reserved mainly for members of The Greenbrier Sporting Club, guests of The Greenbrier will have opportunities to play The Ashford Short Course, a nine-hole, par 3 walking course that opened in 2018. The course will be open April 20 through October 31, and resort guests can make tee times for 9:00am and 2:00pm each day. They will be shuttled from The Greenbrier Golf Club to the course.

# **Coming Attractions**

The PGA TOUR's annual stop at The Greenbrier received a new name and a new mission last summer, becoming *A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier*, with a focus on honoring the United States Military and first responders. This year, the tournament will also get a new date and a new director.

The ninth edition of the tournament, originally known as The Greenbrier Classic, will take place September 9-15, 2019, moving from its traditional July date to a fall spot, the first event of the PGA Tour's 2019-20 season.

The move to September provides the perfect weather conditions for tournament play, with an average high of 76 degrees and an average low of 51 degrees in September in White Sulphur Springs. It also gives tournament officials an opportunity to attract the game's top players, including many European players who were previously unable to attend because of overseas commitments.

Being the first event of the season is also a positive, as players will be anxious to get back on the course after two weeks off – more for those who didn't advance to the final rounds of the FedExCup Playoffs. "We're working hard to make sure we have an excellent field," said Robert Harris, who was named the tournament's new Executive Tournament Director in March. "Being the first event of the year gives us a great shot."

Harris, who is also the Vice President of Golf at The Greenbrier, was recruited to America's Resort<sup>™</sup> in 1991 as the Director of Golf. Since then, he has served in many different roles, including overseeing all of the resort's recreational activities. Before coming to The Greenbrier, he was the Director of Golf at the Ponte Vedra Inn & Club and the Head Golf Professional at The Resort at Glade Springs. A native of Jacksonville, Florida, Harris has been a PGA of America Class A member since 1980.

A graduate of Brigham Young University, Harris holds a MS in Psychology. He is married to Judith Walz-Harris, a practicing attorney, and the couple has three grown children (one a current member of the U.S. Armed Forces) and four young grandchildren spread across the globe.

"I am thrilled and honored to be able to lead this fantastic tournament that brings the best golfers in the world to The Greenbrier each year," said Harris. "We are extremely

HNS Sports Group has been leading and supporting professional and charity golf tournaments in the United States and throughout the world since 2000.

A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier is well aware of the significance of its date, since the anniversary of September, 11, 2001, falls during tournament week, and as a result will increase its focus on honoring the military and first responders, as well as committing funds to organizations that provide aide to causes that impact these heroes.

In addition to seven days of world-class golf, A *Military Tribute at The Greenbrier* will also feature fantastic fan experiences such as military flyovers, a paratrooper skydive, a kids zone and much more. "We want the fan experience to be tremendous," said Harris. "We're working on making logistics like purchasing tickets, parking and entering and exiting the tournament smoother for the fans that make this event what it is each year."

The tournament rounds September 12-15 will be aired live around the world on Golf Channel.

Since its debut in 2010, *A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier* has drawn the top golfers on the PGA TOUR to The Old White TPC, a 1914 CB Macdonald classic. Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson, Bubba Watson, Jordan Spieth, Paul Casey, Dustin Johnson, Justin Thomas, Sergio Garcia, Xander Schauffele and Keegan Bradley are just a few of the stars who have walked the fairways of The Old White TPC during tournament play, and Harris is confident this year's field will be among the best.
